

SELF INTRODUCTION LESSON PLAN (SHS)

STEP 1- ME TIME!

LEARNING FOCUS – LISTENING

INTRODUCE YOURSELF

Start off your introduction by telling your students about yourself.

TIPS!

- Write your name in katakana on the board for students.
- Speak about your family and friends

INTRODUCE YOUR COUNTRY AND CULTURE

Let the students learn about your country and culture.

Be sure to use visuals

- Authentic Materials
- Laminated pictures
- Videos
- Power Point Presentation

STEP 2 - TALK TIME!

LEARNING FOCUS – WRITING & SPEAKING

INTERACT WITH YOUR STUDENTS

The students are excited to meet you and they will have questions. Give them a chance to ask their new ALT questions (in English!).

- In groups, have students write two or more questions to ask you.
- After time is up, have one student from each group ask you their questions.

TIPS!

- Ask the students to say their names before asking you their question.
- Have prepared blank papers to give each group to write their questions on to keep them focused.

INVOLVE YOUR JTE

Ask you JTE to help students with making their questions.

STEP 3 - GAME TIME!

LEARNING FOCUS – SPEAKING & READING

REVIEW YOUR LESSON

It's time to have fun and more importantly review your self introduction.

GAME IDEAS

SIMPLE REVIEW AND QUIZ

- Make a multiple choice worksheet about culture and have students fill it out.
- Have them answer in teams.

JEOPARDY

- Play JEOPARDY about you and/or your country. Give choices, so it is easier.

TIPS!

- Use your small souvenirs from your home country as prizes.

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MORE GAME AND ACTIVITY IDEAS

FOUR CORNERS

- Prep questions about you. Each corner of the room is an answer choice (a, b, c, d). Students move according to the answer they choose.

FRUIT BASKETS

- One student stands in the middle and says something they like. Everyone who likes the same thing has to move.

EXTRAS

INTERVIEW BINGO

- Students ask their classmates things they like and fill in all the BINGO boxes.
- Afterwards, students present what they like and their answers can be crossed out.
- You can give prizes to the first three people that get BINGO.

CLASSROOM ENGLISH & THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

Because this is your first lesson, your JTE may want to review some key “Classroom English” phrases.

If you want to start something (ie. Raffle, letters, stamp card, etc.), introduce it in this lesson.
