BRAINSTORMING METHODS

- Word association
- Opposite matching
- Mind/cluster map



BRAINSTORMING METHODS

Word association

- Make a list of words that relates to one word
- Example: make of a list of words relating to "circle"



BRAINSTORMING METHODS

Opposite matching

- Make a list of the exact opposite of what you're trying to think of
- Charades→ Audience tells you what to do
- Shiritori→ pictures instead of words
- Personality→ appearance



BRAINSTORMING METHODS

Cluster map

- Write a word in the center of the paper
- Write related words around in it and connect them with lines
- Creating interconnected branches can lead to fun and unexpected ideas

Cluster map

ONCE YOU HAVE AN IDEA...

- Let it incubate (sleep on it)
- Don't fall in love with your first idea
- Simpler is sometimes better
- Be prepared to sell the academic value of your idea

- Especially in another language



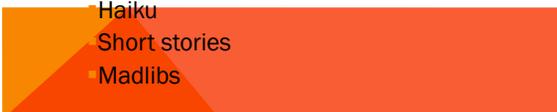
MAKING A CREATIVE FRAMEWORK
